
Thank You!- Thank you to the Bell Choir who will be serving the May 4 Bridges meal! **Helpers Needed: SUMM Meal**— Help is needed to provide and serve food for the hungry! On Thursday, May, 27, our church is responsible for preparing and serving the entree for the SUMM End of the Month Meal at Grace United Methodist Church. This meal will be packaged and delivered to people who drive up to the door. In recent months there have been over 100 people who have been served meals so we will need be prepared to serve as many as 125 people! The menu for the May 27th meal will be goulash, green beans, and French bread. If you are able to provide any of the following items, please contact Ann Ure (319-759-2990) or the church office:

- Crockpot (2 1/2 quart size) of goulash (6 crockpots are needed; your own recipe is great!
- Green beans for 25 people (5 units of 25 servings each are needed; we will heat the beans)
- Loaves of French bread (13 loaves are needed; please cut a loaf into 10 slices and butter)

• Five people are also needed to serve the meal.

If you are unable to help but would like to donate money for food, please write "SUMM meal" on the memo of your check.
