

Help Needy Children Near and Far

First United Methodist Mission Committee is supporting two service projects for children 07/04 that begin this summer!

Our annual Ingathering collection of school supplies for children in families living in developing countries will begin in July when store sales begin. Sending their children to school can be too expensive for many families. They face the unhappy choice of sending only one child to school, having their children share supplies, or not having their children go to school at all, if 07/07 they are not able to provide the needed supplies.

Toys for Tots is an event sponsored by local Marines to distribute toys to needy children 07/11 Although not as exciting to receive, Shared United Ministries distributes underwear and diapers 07/12 area children at this December event at Memorial Auditorium. Last year SUM gave 894 children package of underwear or diapers. The yearly cost of all this underwear runs between \$8,000 to \$10.000

SUM is able to do this with the combined work of First UMC, West Hill UMC, Grace UM Spring Grove UMC, and Zion Church. Report from your Finance Committee: As we reach the midway part of 2024 it is a good time to let our members know how we're doing with supporting the mission and ministry of our church. Giving this year is down from 1 year ago, and you may not be aware that we used \$80,000 from the contingency fund to keep up with expenses in 2023. Giving this year is \$115,687.84, so transfers from the contingency fund and other unrestricted funds has had to be used to stay current on our expenses. We are continuing to operate below the budget approved for 2024, but with less than expected income, we are still out of balance. Your Finance Committee members are working to identify other areas for expense savings. Please check your giving record to determine if you are up to date on your planned giving to the church, and/or if you can stretch your budget to give an addition gift to help your church do the work in this community that we do, pay our staff and maintain our beautiful facilities.
